


The Association raffle of a Mercury outboard was drawn on the 9th November, 1987. The winner being R. Murdoch.

Ray Meagher wishes to remind members to continue collecting their aluminium cans to assist in raising extra revenue for the Association.






The next event for Tubs and Formula 8's will be held on Herridges Lake on the 6th of December. This event will include Dinghy Racing and be designed as a family day.




