RECORD SMASHED IN BLACKWOOD



The 1991 Blackwood saw an above average water level approximately 12" higher than 1990, although nowhere near the height of the then race record year of 1998.

The race record was held by the Transeals team of Ray Meagher and outboard motor guru Brad Pitcher, in 6 hours 46 with an average speed of

This year the team Velmade No.2 boat of Mark Whately and new crew David Snooks wiped 16 mins off the record to 6 hours 30 with an average speed of 39km/h for the distance.

It's been a vintage year for boat 116 in setting the inaugural race record in the Nannup Cup Sprint. 17 minutes off the then Goodbody Bros Avon Descent record time and 16 minutes off the Blackwood record.

Seeing the water level was relatively high, Mark Whately was one of three boats to leave Bridgetown with bronze swinging off the prop shaft (the other two ended up upside down at one stage or another during day 1). Mark carried on to be the second boat to Nannup some 41/2 minutes behind the Goodbody Bros (black prop).

Day 2 saw a different set of circumstances with all the front row going bronze. Departing grid 1 the Goodbodys (162) immediately struck electrical

problems, this opening the way for 116, 105, 139, 117, 124 and standard boats 123 and 190, 116 lead for a short time before being passed by 123 and 105.

Russell Wilson went on to prove that staying upright is just as important as hull speed and was first to Sue's Bridge by approximately two minutes.

Day 3 saw a large cold front pass over the south west of the state and rough conditions were expected with reverse order starting procedure. Any one of the top three boats was still in the hunt.

Boat 162 had the fastest time of the day from 116 and 105. But the time he lost on day 2 had given the outright lead to 116. Second was 105 and third was 162.

All in all it was a tidy effort from the winning boat with a low key percentage only approach taking them to their

COMMODORE'S REPORT

Well the two big ones are over for yet another year and in both cases racing conditions can only be

Congratulations to all members who finished in this year's Blackwood Classic 250. Mark Whately seems to be unstoppable in the Sports Class winning the two main races Avon, Blackwood and not forgetting the one day Nannup Cup. Rob deJoode has shown that he is a force to be reckoned with in the standard class, taking out the Blackwood and Nannup Cup.

As we all know only too well, the standard boats are setting an incredibly fast pace and in fact they are only just a smidge slower than the sports boats, a feat which seems amazing when you consider their only real restrictions are their propellors. After seeing the props the lead boats were swinging at scrutineering, I can now understand why, mind you, they were legal under our current rules.

It is however, the Committee's intention to ask members to establish a rules clarification committee specifically aimed at reviewing the class rules. It is hoped that the class can go back to what it was originally intended to be and that is a standard class.

Regrettably, this year's Blackwood saw two competitors injured during the event. Paul Tregurtha received serious leg injuries on day one, but continued day two, resulting in near permanent damage to his leg. He retired from the race on completion of day two and after achieving fourth place. Grant Pouw Bray suffered a ruptured kidney on day two and was taken to Bunbury Hospital where he underwent surgery on Tuesday to have his kidney

I am sure all members wish both racers a speedy recovery with the hope of seeing both of them back in the water when health commits

In both cases, medical attention was not available on the course, which in my mind was totally inexcusable, this however was not the only instance of race mismanagement. I have forwarded a letter to the Blackwood Classic 250, stating my concern relating to the sub-standard organisation of this year's event.

It is the committee's firm belief that the race's shortcomings must be addressed in the interest of all members and the sport itself. Through WASDA we will seek to rectify the situation and I ask all PDRC members to offer their input and support to elevate this race to a level it so justifiably deserves.

RULES CLARIFICATION

At least one member objected to having his motor impounded and pulled down during this years Blackwood Classic.

LIFEJACKETS

Be aware that the scrutineer has the right to pull down <u>any</u> entrant's motor as per the following set of rules from the WASDA Power Dinghy Racing Manual.

POST-COMPETITION SCRUTINEERING

- 9.7 Where provided for in the Supplementary Regulations all place winning craft will be impounded for scrutineering immediately the craft finishes the competition and is known to be a place winner (see Definition of Craft in the Specifications).
- 9.8 Other craft may be impounded for scrutineering at the finish of a competition if so decided by the Organiser/Organising Committee.
- 9.9 The driver or nominated representative only must be present during post-competition scrutineering.
- 9.10 Should the Organiser/ Organising Committee so decide the outboard motor may be

Beware the chief scrutineer is on the warpath over cheating on propellors in the standard class.

A number of boats were disqualified from the Blackwood for thinning propellor blades and illegal repairs. One entrant was also found to have oversize ports and reed settings. Cheating doesn't pay in the long run!

An unfortunate accident during the Blackwood resulted in club member Grant Pouw Bray being rushed to Bunbury Hospital and having one kidney removed. We are happy to report that Grant is now off the critical list and improving well. I'm sure all club members extend their best wishes for a speedy recovery.

Also sent to the same hospital was Paul Tregurtha who apparently suffered a serious knee injury during the race.

The Commodore will be asking for the club's input on whether we should apply a ceiling on outboard capacities at the next meeting. As the rule stands, any manufacturers' 8hp qualifies, but one school of thought believes we are going fast enough and should restrict racing to 211cc motors and under. If you have got something to say, don't miss the next meeting.

At the Blackwood scrutineering on Sunday September 22, club members had some first hand experience with car thieves in a stolen Commodore. After these young thugs drove into the car park at high speed and saw what was happening, they took off, also at high speed, smashing into the rear of Jamie Georges parked car on the way. They caused considerable damage and a very large repair bill.

At the time of this incident the car park was full of members and their families and Jamie had parked his car in an effort to protect the many children that were near the scrutineering van.


