# FREDERICKSTOWN CUP '92 IS BIGGEST YET!

Several hundred dinghy racers, families and supporters headed south to Albany for Easter in preparation for the 1992 Frederickstown Cup for Bathtubs. F.8's, and Dinghy events.

The weekend turned into a party affair commencing with the annual Skinns golf game in which Geoff Hall took out the purse, party games in the chalets, Rob De Joode's pre-race hair style by Colleen Skewes and four litres of mousse, the Overstone's 1989 Disco Chalet looking more like a crechè this year under the control of 'Uncle Dave Snooks', and Kieth Parnell keeping himself warm with his gas

Racing got underway on Saturday morning on the foreshore of the Kalgan River Caravan Park with Bathtubs and F.8's. Strong north-westerly gusts had a breathtaking effect on the tubs. The rescue crews were kept extremely busy, particularly by yet another spectacular flip from Frank Berloth

Geoff Hall and Darren Austin tussled for buoy positions (they both lost) while the 'Ali' tubs of Justin Skewes and Brad Watson showed just how well they could handle the conditions, finishing first and second. They were followed by a consistent John Haynes and then Gary Evans.

Formula 8 racing again showed a further increase on entries with Mark Wilson putting in a good 'first up' performance and Brent and Kerry Barden making it a family affair as they swapped positions on buoys.

Kim Webb again took line honours Scott Bennett hung on to second place and will be a force for the State Championship next year. Colleen Skewes came in third followed by Brent Bardon.

The strengthening nor-westerlies forced the postponement of the Pee Wees until Sunday Morning. With much appreciated help from the Pee Wee parents, racing got underway by 8 a.m. Sunday and continued after the dinghy event.

Justine and Narelle Watson again proved their superiority by winning their individual groups with Leigh Hindle and Todd Williamson obtaining second spots. Chris Parnell fronted with his own boat for the first time and was driving harder while the Bevan sisters were forced out with a broken

Sunday 9.30 a.m. saw a Le Mans start for Dinghies with Williamson and Maxfield leading DeJoode and Gerrick in standard while Skewes and Street held off Berloth and Bardon in sports, as they worked their way into the estuary.

In the blustery conditions on Oyster Harbour Berloth and Bardon pulled away from Skewes and Street while boats 190, 117 and 022 of Darren and Wayne Austin flipped out of the race. The drag race back to the finish from the re-start in the King River saw the positions remain unchanged with Ian Williamson and Tony Maxfield holding first place for standard with 'Flying Frank Berloth' claiming the honours in sports class.

The weekend culminated with a big Presentation and plenty of throat lubrication and yarn swapping from the huge contingent of racers, supporters and families eminating from over seventy entries in the weekend's racing.

# **RULES CLARIFICATION**

### **Proposals**

I propose that the following motion replace clause 3.6 of standard dinghy specifications.

Only propellors as supplied by the manufacturer for that model motor shall be used. Bronze propellors shall not be used. Metal may not be removed from the propellor with the exception of repairs made to the leading edges of the propellor blades. Propellor blades may not be cupped or the pitch altered. Damage to leading edges of the propellor blades may only be repaired by cutting the edge back. The cut must be perpendicular to the surface of the blade (ie. After the repair is made, the leading edges must be square and the entire back and front surfaces of the blade must remain intact.)

The transom shall be permanently fixed by nothing less than 6mm bolts and nylock nuts.

I propose the motion that the motion carried on the meeting of March concerning motor height and propellor diameter be deleted.

The following motions have been proposed by WASDA for acceptance into the PDRC Competition Rules and Specifications.

- The scrutineer for a WASDA event may not compete in that event.
- 2) Rule 17.10. Championship points for the Avon Descent and Blackwood Classic 250 to be double the points for other events, i.e.

1st: 200 4th: 80

2nd: 160 5th: 40

3rd: 120

Starting 2 (not placegetters) Finishing 10 (not placegetters)

- A new race class to be adopted for dinghy racing called ALLOY CLASS.
  - Boats must be aluminium with one piece transom.
    Motors must be 10 years old or
  - older.
  - Propellors must be new. (ie. manufacturer's and straight from box)
  - Other specifications as per Standard Class.

- Rule 21.1. (Outboard motor after handles...to read) propellors including those carried in the boat during the course of an event to meet class specifications.
- 5) The WASDA and PDRC championship to include trophies for both Sports Dinghies and Standard Dinghies individually.


