LOGUE BROOK REGATTA -ANOTHER TOP FAMILY WEEKEND

Once again, Logue Brook proved to be a very popular weekend for dinghy racing families with big fields of Tubs, Dinghies and Formula 8s.

The caravan park was packed to the gunnels with tents. caravans and dinghy trailers and plenty of lies were told to the wee hours of the mornings around camp fires.

The Regatta kicked off with some spectacular dinghy circuit racing on Saturday.

In a course that was shortened by the local Marine and Harbours inspection to stay clear of the 5 knot limit area, there was plenty of gunnel crunching at the first buoy.

None were more competitive than the Parnell/Black, De Joode/Gerrick and Williamson/Maxfield entries who were going to fight it out to the bitter end for championship points. (Pretty Boy Rob De Joode was less than impressed when he found out later that they weren't racing for points on Saturday).

The Suzuki powered 'Pink Flyer' once again proved unbeatable in around-the-buoys-racing. Sunday kicked off with the Around-The-Dam Dinghy Race.

After a Le Mans style start Skews/Watson established a slender lead downwind but when they turned the buoy into the stiff breeze, it was a different matter

The aircraft carrier of Frank Berloth came punching up through the chop and was the first home on the first lap.

After the restart for the final reverse lap, he couldn't be headed and beat the field home by 8 seconds.

The Regatta continued with some hair-raising Tub and Formula 8 racing on the short course.

With 11 Tubs in the water, the first buoy was a nightmare.

On the second Tub race, John Haynes flipped after rounding the first buoy and wasn't able to be avoided by Neville Watson who was right on his stern

As a result John Haynes received a 6cm cut on his elbow from Neville's propellor

The ever alert rescue teams were there instantly and were quick to get John ashore and into the hands of the event medical officer.

After he was bundled off to the Harvey Hospital, John came back that afternoon. The incident brought home to us all how dangerous dinghy racing can be and how important safety

In the Tub racing, Brad Watson, Justin Skews and Justin Ferguson were the ones to beat.

After driving his heart out all day Brad Watson was disqualified for unintentionally having an illegal motor. The borrowed motor had opened reed stops and unfortunately resulted in him losing all his championship points. (Let this be a lesson to us all!)

In the Formula 8s, the H.C. Jones team from Bridgetown proved unbeatable despite some spirited charges from Coleen Skews.

In the Pee Wees, Justine Watson maintained top position on a count back alongside Todd Williamson in the other heat.

After the presentation, the party continued to the very small hours with the lies getting bigger and the jokes longer — the end of another very successful event.

Thanks must go to the Berloths, the rescue teams, particularly Fairhurst who performed very maturely under pressure and the medical officer Craig Smetheren who volunteered his time for the event.

AMENDMENT OF COMPETITION RULES

The proposed amendment to competition rules for standard class dinghies that was published in last months magazine was voted on at the March 9 general meeting and was passed by a majority vote. The proposed amendment will now be taken to the next W.A.S.D.A. meeting and if voted in then will become the Standard Class Rules 3.6, 3.8, 3.9. But until then the rules remain unchanged.

PERSONAL ACCIDENT PROPOSAL

I propose that the P.D.R.C. arrange for the insurance of all licence holders, that they be adequately covered for Death and Disability and Accident for injuries sustained in the course of dinghy, bathtub and formula 8 racing. The insurance cost is to be covered by the relevant rise in club annual fees. Fees to increase by \$35.00 per licence to cover insurance for 1992/1993 licence.

AMENDMENT TO RULE 3.6

I propose that the following amendment be adopted to Power Dinghy Specification 3 Craft Standard Class Rule 3.6. Only propellors as supplied by the manufacturer for that model motor shall be used. Propellors raced may be repaired but must be larger than a stated minimum diameter of 8½ inches. The forward and rear faces of the blade cannot be thinned or cupped and propellors must have a bull nose.

INSURANCE

You will notice that you will be voting on a proposal at the next club meeting for the PDRC to provide Accident Insurance on all license holders while dinghy racing.

The policy recommended by the committee covers the club for Public Liability up to \$5,000,000, Accident and Death up to \$30,000 (on a sliding scale) and Loss of Income up to \$300 per week for 18 months.

The committee is proposing to raise club and license fees to cover the cost. It will mean a rise of \$15 on license fees and \$30 on club fees per member per annum.

The committee is firmly in favour of this proposal and urges you to consider your vote wisely.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Be aware that as per new rules that have been instituted as a result of the Coronial Inquiry into the death at the Avon last year, all licences will become null and void as from April 30.

A new form of licence will be issued for the 1992/1993 season which will require competitors to pass a new Fitness Test (which will replace the old swim test) and provide a medical certificate. The new licence will also incorporate a personal accident insurance policy.

The licence fee will rise as a result, but the figure is yet to be recommended by the committee.

WASDA has no option in accepting these changes as they are the result of a Court of Inquiry recommendation.
