

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At the Saturday Night Karaoke Night, Motor Mouth Mark Whatley led the 'Whatley and the Dinghy Races' to the microphone with their rendition of New York New York, followed by 'Mark Inis and the Tribe' with something no one heard (luckily). But the night belonged to Kevin Pratter who made everyone listen to just about every song ever recorded on a Karaoke machine, out of tune!

Sunday morning scrutineering was held by Geof Hall (his first time in the seat) with many problems arising. 8.30 a.m. briefing was held and competitors were anxious for a start

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The water level caught most racers by surprise as the logs which were 2 feet out of the water last year were now 4 feet high. This meant trying to go underneath, resulting in at least two of the front runners, 105 and 139, coming to grief.

At checkpoint 2, there was only 6 seconds between boats 105 and 116 with Fast Frank just 3 minutes further back. In Standard class Pretty Boy was 1 second behind, with 011 two minutes behind, and then another two minutes to 047.

Boat casualties to the first checkpoint were only light with two boats 003 and 034 not making Barrabup. With cut-out times in effect, boats screamed off for Jalbarragup. Boat 061 was the only boat not to make it. By checkpoint 3 numbers were starting to diminish, with boats 081, 197, 101, 016 and others missing Mileanup ford. By the end of the race 15 boats were out.

As the race progressed towards Sues Bridge, the water level seemed to get lower with numerous rapid sections causing propeller damage, not normally associated with this a section of river.

Two Rescue Craft entered the water during the event, one at Nannup Bridge, crewed by Stretch and Steve Fuller, The other at Jalbarragup. Both craft had a busy day but by checkpoint 3, the second rescue boat was out with a hole in the side. This left Stretch and Steve to clean up the river. By 3.30 the boys reached Mileanup with no fuel and no props. With communication between checkpoints made available by S.E.S., fuel and props were on the way. Only a few Klms later, Stretch and Steve were paddling with a broken propshaft. They were found by S.E.S. at about 8.30 p.m. An hour and a half later, rigged up with a new battery and spotties the boys were back in the river determined to find the remaining two boats. At about midnight, just before Judy's Road, Stretch and Steve arrived safely with the four lost competitors. On Ya boys!

Boat number 116 crewed by Craig Whatley and Trevor Gerrick were outright winners. The organising committee congratulates all placegetters and apologies to those inconvenienced by the non event presentation function. We also offer sincere thanks to Charlie Gilbert, The Nannup Lions, The Nannup S.E.S., Nannup St John Ambulance, Policeman John Birt, George Cox, Cameron Wilkie, Steve Fuller, Darren and Wayne Austin, The Nannup Hotel, Velmade Products, Captain Cook Cruises and Phillips Furniture.

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During the last season we had an unprecedented run of accidents in major and minor events.

Although the incident at Nannup didn't involve any injury, it demonstrated how we have to be prepared for every situation.

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Officers from the State Emergency Service later praised the Race Director Tay Overstone, the race officials and rescue teams for the way they handled a very difficult situation.

The PDRC committee will be reviewing the incident in an effort to improve procedures further.

A diamond encrusted medal for bravery should go to Stretch Wilkie and Steve Fuller who put the repaired rescue boat back in the river at 10.30 p.m. to go looking for the lost parties.

Be aware, dinghy racing is a serious business! Racers should always prepare for the worst situation rather than thinking about the bare minimum.

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

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RULES CLARIFICATION

Proposal

I propose that the following motion be put to Northam's Avon Descent Association and the Blackwood River Sports Club to replace their forthcoming Sub Regulations.

Each member entering an Avon Descent or Blackwood Classic must compete in any two W.A.S.D.A. sanctioned events within 24 months prior to the said event.

Proposed: Neville Watson Seconded: Kevin Lawrence

Proposed Motion for Competition Rule 19.

Any amendment to a Motion being debated at a General Meeting called for that purpose may be ratified in the debate and accepted by the Chairman on the night as long as it stays to the original amendments intent.

Proposed: Gary Evans Seconded: Darren Austin

RULE CHANGES

The following Rule changes have been accepted by W.A.S.D.A. and will be in force for the 1992 season as from June 30, including this years Avon Descent.

Only propellors as supplied by the manufacturer for that model motor shall be used. Metal may not be removed from the propellor with the exception of repairs made to the leading edges of the propellor blades. Propellor blades may not be cupped or pitch altered. Damage to leading edges of t the propellor blades may only be repaired by cuting the edge back. The cut must be perpendicular to the surface of the blade (ie After the repair is made, the leading edges must be squar and the entire back and front surfaces of the blade must remain intact.)

- Rule 21.1. (Outboard motor after handles...to read) propellors including those carried in the boat during the course of an event to meet class specifications.
- (3) The scrutineer for a W.A.S.D.A event may not compete in that event.
- Rule 17.10. Championship points for the Avon Descent and Blackwood Classic 250 to be double the points for other events, i.e.

1st: 200 4th: 80 2nd: 160 5th: 40 3rd: 120

Starting 2 (not placegetters)
Finishing 10 (not placegetters)

- A new race class to be adopted for dinghy racing called ALLOY CLASS Boats must be aluminium with one
- piece transom. Motors must be 10 years old or older
- Propellors must be new. (ie. Manufacturer's and straight from box)
 - Other specifications as per Standard


Thanks must go to Zodiac Inflatables W.A. for donating repair work on the rescue boats, amounting to several hundred dollars. Well done guys!
