The 1992 Sunnyside Down attracted an original field of 21 entrants. unfortunately three withdrew before the start leaving a field of 18 to attempt the upstream challenge.

The 18 consisted of 13 standard boats which were started at 30 second intervals then a 10 minute break to the five sports

The more adventurous hit the basin at full speed and some were rewarded with a five minute buffer at the Winnijup Falls

Four standard boats didn't make the regroup and the sweep boat was held at Checkpoint 5.

The crew of 191 kindly offered to check between CP5 and the regroup, found 081 and 103 and turned them back to CP5 where they subsequently withdrew.

PDRC COMMODORE'S **REPORT**

With final club dues in and Avon entries counted, the Committee has a final picture of the level of membership this year and the news is not good.

So far only 250 members have renewed. down from 396 last year.

It is apparent that the recession combined with the dramatic rise in membership fees due to the requirements for insurance, the "two race rule" and possibly, the death in the 1991 Avon, have all had a compounding effect on new members joining the sport.

While the committee was expecting a drop in membership, we were not expecting a fall of this magnitude.

As the PDRC has a number of fixed overheads such as the insurance, rent. newsletter etc, the loss of revenue will make it tough to stay out of the red this

It is obvious to me that the main reason that members have not renewed is that they are finding it difficult to finance the cost of racing and have therefore felt it unnecessary to renew their membership.

The fact is that if you are not racing this vear you can still rejoin the club as a nonracing member without the need to pay the insurance levy which almost cuts the fees

This way, they get to keep their number and receive all the other benefits such as the newsletter etc.

We need your help in keeping the membership levels up.



W.A.S.D.A. has finalised the insurance for club members for the 1992/903 season.

For those who are unsure of the cover, here are the details.

PUBLIC LIABILITY \$5,000,000 PERSONAL ACCIDENT

Capital Benefit: \$30,000

Weekly Benefit:

Income Earners \$300

(1 x weekly salary to a maximum of the sum insured for 104 weeks).

Non income earners \$300.

Payable as 80% reimbursement of domestic home help/patient bedcare where deemed necessary by a duly qualified medical practitioner. 52 week period.

Benefits are reduced to 50% in respect of an injury/accident which occurs during travel to/from the event location.

There is a 14 day elimination period.

This year the financial pressure on the Avon Descent Association is greater than ever with a severe drop in entrants. They have been fortunate though, to retain their corporate sponsors Caltex, Coates and Channel 9. For the future of the event, it is imperative that these sponsors are all looked after. Please display their stickers PROMINENTLY on your dinghy.

Supplementary Regulations

ENTRY FEE:

\$40 per entry, non refundable. All entry fees over and above running costs will go to prizemoney. Entry must be on an official WASDA Entry Form.

CLASSES:

8 H.P. Sport. 8 H.P. Standard. Entry in more than one class is not permitted.

START ORDER:

Will be by ballot, Entries close 25.8.921.

REPLACEMENT PARTS:

No replacement parts other than those specified under clause 9.1 WASDA rulebook.

WITHDRAWALS:

Entrants withdrawing during the race MUST advice the nearest check point official. Failure to do so will incur a \$50 penalty.

CANCELLATION:

Should the water level be too low to hold the event, the race will be moved to Baldivis Water Ski Park. Entrants should contact 447 6424 to confirm venue before

START:

The proposed starting area is approximately 600m down stream from Cowala Road bridge.

Access to this point is via private property from the northern side of the Moore River. The property is currently owned by Mr Rob Rathbone, access though and camping on this property has been granted.

The position of the start may vary due to water level.

CHECK POINTS:

Checkpoint 1 is to be located at Benny Road Crossing. There is limited access to this crossing for support crew and spectators, unless in four wheel drive vehicles.

Checkpoint 2 is on private property and limited access only.

Checkpoint 3 is again privately owned, there is no vehicle access to this property. It is a 300m walk, making spectator access limited.

Checkpoint 4 is at Lancelin Road bridge. There is a parking area, this area is easily accessible to both support crews and spectators.

IME:

The fastest boat should be able to

complete the approximate 50km race in a time of 2 hours, the slowest boat should take no longer than 5 hours.

Proposed start time: 10.00am Scrutineering: Will be at 9.00am

Briefing: Will be at 9.45am.

Of the race is to be taken from the start line at Cowala Rd (downstream)

Cowala Rd (downstream) from the bridge until Checkpoint 4.

FAILURE TO REACH CHECKPOINTS IN TIME:

Any boat failing to reach the above checkpoints before the cut off times instructed by the race director shall be removed from the water at the appropriate checkpoint.

RECOVERY:

Any craft breaking down shall be towed to the nearest checkpoint where it shall be removed from the water, and shall take no further part in the race.


The recovery of these craft will be by a sweep and recovery boat manned by two competent people with previous experience.
