

### BLACKWOOD CLASSIC 250

#### **Sports**

Well Suzuki and Ian Williamson came up with the goods with their first win as a combo in a major river race (note Ian has the Blackwood before).

Ian as well as the other placegetters in the top four proved the old adage "to finish first, first you must finish".

Many of the top guns tried to win the race on the first day (some in the first five minutes), only to come unstuck. They then had to play serious catch up for the rest of the event.

Early race favourite, 123 repeated their 1991 trick of performing without a net, going over upside down, back-to-front down the first major rapid.

That left the initial tussle between 190, 105, and 124. With both 105 and 124 suffering in the legs department, they had to resort to Flinstone power (paddles) for that extra edge over each other down the long pools.

At the back of the pack 162 and 117 were making up for their poor grid starts. At the same time Rod Thomas and Brent Barden were also trying to zig-zag together. For most of the first day in boat 135, one would zig while the other zagged, and the boat not knowing which way to go, went upside down.

All the while 166 was getting on with the job.....

By the end of the first day, the top few were close, and the rest of the field was spread out quite dramatically. During the pitstop repairs the usual war stories were told - if only...

While the tales were flying so to were the blazing spanners of 124 - they were carrying out a quick (12 min.) trunk change.

The next day the water started to open out.

The top four jostled for positions, while everyone else played catch up.

With fewer logs to jump and thinning trees it became a sprint which was to repeated on day three for all of the classes.

The weir became a bubble, and the tide was low. The low tide did however result in more than one boat running aground, just after the entry to the estuary.

#### Standard

Almost from the drop of the flag boat 127 was never headed. They showed a turn of speed

that represented the third fastest time overall.
