NANNUP CUP

A smoothly run race in beautiful conditions sums up the season opener - The Nannup Cup. Once again several craft required recovery. Fortunately they were all out of the water before a serious cold snap set in.

Although Race Director David Whitney was heard to say the 'race ran itself' with the help of everyone involved, all the racers were glad to see the Whitneys back involved in the race.

With the Nannup Cup being the season opener, all eyes were on the front runners to see who would be in form in the run up to the Avon. As the race evolved it seems the current pacesetters in both classes may not get their own way for much longer.

Sports

Team Velmade (158) did it again. They set a new race record and recorded their second consecutive win. Their win was not as straightforward as the time sheets suggests, with several challengers throwing down the gauntlet. Time will tell whether these challengers can take the fight upto 158 over a full race distance. Certainly 158 came out with a few more battle scars than usual.

During the race Rob De Joode had his hairdryer in turbo mode, to be actually leading the race on corrected time. Unlucky for him, the extension cord unplugged just about the same time as the prop shaft decided to drop off.

Improving on last year's 3rd place was Frank and Grant in the aircraft carrier. This time there was a role reversal with Frank attempting a few landings of his own on other boats through some of the log jumps.

Wrapping up the top three was 117. They recorded the fastest time over one of the sections of the race. Is Justin starting to realise some of that Bathtub championship potential?

Standard

While the sports results had a familiar ring to them, there was plenty of fresh faces in the standard class results.

Boat 163 (Mick Chittick and Dennis Peach) won, and recorded the second fastest overall time in the race. Certainly some of the more seasoned racers were impressed by their efforts. After helping out a disabled boat (185) earlier in the race, 201 came back to claim 2nd. Brad 'Son of Roach' Kitcher and Mark Smith were the big improvers after Albany.

Close on their tail were the two Austins (Darren and Wayne) in 022. Their old tin boat obviously still learning a few new tricks.

Each of the top three certainly look the goods of giving the established standard runners a shake.

Also of note was the 5th placing of the hubbie & wife combo of Kerry and Brent Barden (or should that be Brent & Kerry?). Both debuting as a race team, Kerry's first time in a dinghy race, and Brent first time on the tiller.

There was a misprint in last month's newsletter. There will be no 10hp Sports class, however there will be an alloy class.

The alloy class will be run with no restriction to manufacturer's standard propellers.

Also replacement parts will be allowed.

Class Structure Proposal

The B.R.S.C. have proposed the following class structure for discussion:

Alloy Class - 7.5hp, Fixed nsoms, boat of aluminium construction, no restriction on manufacturer's standard propellers.

Standard Class - 8hp, jack-up transoms, no restriction on manufacturer's standard propellers.

<u>Unlimited</u> - 8hp, no restrictions on boat, motor modifications, or type of propellers used.

If you wish to have a say in the future direction of the classes raced, come along to the next meeting and discuss your thoughts, or put pen to paper.

Rule Amendment Proposals

Amendment to rule 4.2B of the Dinghy Specifications of WASDA to read the same as rule 3.2B under the dinghy specifications (Identification numbers) - "Painted black on a painted bright canary yellow background (inflatables excepted)."

. Bathtub and F8 rules as proposed by the PDRC have been adopted.

. This years Blackwood Classic will not have a 10hp class.

. Jim Smith has been elected as independent chairperson.
