

### **COMMODORES REPORT**

With only days to go before the 1995 Caltex Avon Descent I would like to wish all 150 power boat competitors the very best for a safe and successful race. Of the 75 craft entered there are 16 10HP entries, 20 8HP SPT and 39 8HP STD. This is two more entries than last year and I hope is an indication that the steady decline in entries in our major events over the last few years has come to an end and that we are seeing the beginning of a recovery. The extremely high water is certain to provide an exhilarating ride for all competitors but I urge everyone to take care, don't endanger yourself or your crew and be especially mindful of the paddle craft. NADA officials tell me that last year three canoeist were knocked from their boats by powerboats, all three incidents occurred in the Upper Swan Ti trees and involved leading powerboats. penalties WILL be applied if similar occurrences are reported this year.

The range of craft at scrutineering was very interesting - the rigid hull inflatables are out in force and this could well be their year. There are some superb, innovative designs in Kevlar - look out for 201 and 007, there are still some old tinnies being dusted for yet another run! This diversity of design and co-. is essential to the survival of our sport. We need the talented boatbuilders prepared to spend countless hours designing and building better, faster and more radical craft BUT we also must truly encourage the plodders, the middle of the field competitors who thoroughly enjoy their run down the Avon, but do not wish to spend a fortune, for they are the backbone of the PDRC and we cannot survive without them.

I know that some members have been concerned that the Burswood Clubrooms project has not progressed as quickly in recent months, I am pleased to report that the W.A. Recreational Water Sports Association of which the PDRC has a quarter share now has an acceptable constitution and the office bearers have been appointed. Greg Johnson, one of the two PDRC delegates has been elected as Vice President. On 13 July Norman Moore the WA minister for Sport and Recreation confirmed, in writing, the granting of \$125,000 to be claimed in the 1995/96 financial y to assist with the construction of the clubhouse.

The grant is subject to proof of the raising of \$65,000 by each of the four bodies - the PDRC fund raising committee will shortly be contacting those that have made pledges to finalise payment details and will be approaching all members to attract further contributions.
