
# Racing location details for Tubs and Formula 8s

Pushing her boat to the limit on several of the day's heats, Rebecca Rutherford now heads the ladies' F8 points table with a win at Burswood. As with her brother, Rebecca also had a couple of bad starts but with superb driving skills guickly made up for lost time and worked through the field in several heats.

Jennifer Leek picked up another trophy in her second outing while newcomer Maree Watt in the Branson outfit collected third and will be a threat in future events.

Although not a big field of Ladies F8s, the girls put on a great display of racing, bringing the large crowd to their toes on many occasions. One boat missing on the day was craft 117. Colleen Skewes, who after several very successful seasons of racing has hung up her wetsuit to sit on the shore and sip on a couple of wines.
