COMMODORE'S COMMENTS

November 1996

ongratulations Lynne Berloth and the Blackwood organising committee for a smoothly run and well organised event. The running of any event, and this one in particular, is becoming harder every year with more restrictions being imposed by the authorities, and more scrutiny from the public and environmental groups. This combined with an apparent reluctance by Club members to help with organising, a barrage of new scrutineering requirements and entries not being lodged until the very last minute made Lynne's task as Race Organiser more difficult than it perhaps needed to be—let's hope a few more helpers will be forthcoming when next year's organising committee is being put together!

After two seasons of racing the 10HP Dinghy Class is now firmly entrenched as a part of our sport, the fine tuning (excuse the pun!) of the specifications and competition rules to accommodate the different manufacturers' motors has caused some dramas which have flowed through to the 8 HP class. The additions to the competition rules and changes specifications passed at the October General Meeting, allowing a return to timing and carburettor adjustments, combined with the Standard Class propeller/motor height rules should mean easier and less controversial scrutineering — let's hope it stays that way!

The circuit racing season started in Bunbury, a full race report with photos will be in the December issue, along with a report on the extremely successful public relations exercise at the Kelmscott Show late last month. Several members have mentioned to me that perhaps dinghies should not be circuit racing at all, that we should leave the true circuit racing to F8/F10 and Tubs. There are in fact only three events in which dinghies compete in circuit races — Bunbury, Northam and Rockingham — there could well be merit in the idea of leaving dinghies out of these events, a matter for consideration and discussion.

The Committee has made a commitment to make so headway (yet another pun) on the helmet issue. As a start are visiting several retail helmet outlets this Thursday with the intention of checking a range of helmets that will then be presented to a combined Management Committee/ Rules Committee meeting for approval. We will keep you informed of progress BUT meanwhile if there is a helmet which you consider appropriate for racing but does not conform to the present criteria, please let me know. I have also decided that every effort will be made to produce an updated 'yellow book' before the term of office of this committee expires. This involves trying to find all the niggling little errors and contradictions AND including every rule change that has been approved since the last printing - not an easy task and again any assistance would be much appreciated. The role of WASDA in our administration will need to be clarified before any reprint of the rules is considered- I will be writing to the WASDA Chairperson to ask that WASDA meet and make recommendations on its future as a governing body of Power Dinghy Racing in WA.

RULE PROPOSALS

The following proposed change to the Competition Rules will be debated and voted on at the 11 November General Meeting.

It is proposed that Competition Rule 22-14, which reads: 22-14(a) Formula 8 competitors shall not accumulate WASDA competition driver licence points.

be amended to read:

22-14(a) Formula 8 and <u>Formula 10</u> competitors shall not accumulate WASDA competition <u>dinghy</u> driver licence points.

RULE AMENDMENTS

The following proposals were debated and passed at the 14 October General Meeting.

Addition to Competition Rules

2.10 Beach Landings

A landing shall be defined as a Beach Landing if as a result of that landing more than 50% of the craft is removed from the water.

Motion 1

An additional Class of racing shall be introduced, the Class shall be called Formula 10 and shall be the existing Formula 8 craft but powered by motors up to 10 HP.

Motion 2

The following rules shall apply to Formula 10s:

- a) The driver must be a minimum of 14 years of age and must hold at least 1,000 driver points, 500 of which have been accrued in F8 Senior Class. Points to be allocated as per dinghy competition rules.
- b) The Formula 10s shall, in the first instance be an additional Class ie all existing F8 and Bathtub classes shall continue to race. Both Ladies and Men shall be eligible to race Formula 10s.
- c) All rules pertaining to Formula 8s (with the exception of horsepower rating) shall apply to Formula 10s, including the type of helmet to be worn.

Add new specification 8.31 Tuning specification which are adjustable (ignition timing and carburetter butterfly) may be adjusted within the limits of their linkages.

Rule 7 - Classes:

The 211cc maximum cylinders capacity in 8 HP be deleted from Rule 7.1 which includes Class 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8.

1996 BLACKWOOD CLASSIC 250

High water, wet weather and bloody cold

West rain which continued over the weekend, competitors soon became aware that speed and not attrition was going to be the main factor in winning the 1996 Blackwood Classic 250.

With a slight increase in entries on 1995, the majority of craft made a clean start with Jon Faull and new deckie Justin Ferguson out of grid one. Hot favourite in 8 Sports, boat **064** Kim Bolvary teamed up with Lesley Brooker, had to head straight for the bank with chopper problems (most spectators thought they may have been setting up a sausage

le). While **144** and **054** both took a tumble on the first rapid before getting into race mode.

Blackwood novice Shane Tregurtha (139) looked his usual calm self at the start line while novice support crew (father Paul) was returning once again from the public conveniences suffering from "pre-race support crew nerves".

A large contingent of Power Dinghy followers gathered at checkpoint 3 to see who would lead the field amongst the 10 HP boys and girls. To no surprise the pink Good, Bad and Ugly Goodbody and Green outfit has pulled out a 1 min 30 lead over Russell Wilson and Gary Tanner (105), hotly pursued by Frank Berloth and Grant Pouw-Bray 124 with the 129 outfit obviously suffering mechanical problems, judging by the sound of the Tohatsu.

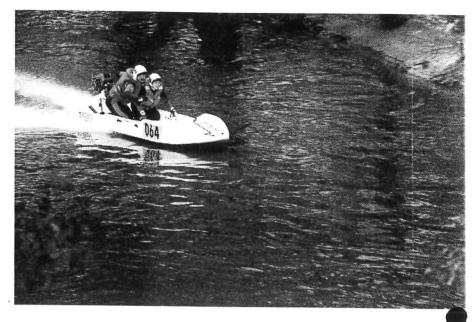
Polvary and Brooker cut through the field

After their startline dramas **064** had moved through the field to lead 8HP Sports with **177** and **007** also cruising along nicely and picking up a couple of 10 HP on the way.

Smile on his dial

Harry Burgess with Stuart Maxwell at the helm of 171 had a smile from ear to ear (unless he had wind) as the modified and much lighter duck hunted down and killed arch rival and mate, the 176 Breheny craft. The other big grinners in the field in 044, the Branson Brothers, headed the Standard field and were looking good, but 028 Brent and Kerry Barden were not letting them get away, even though suffering a severely broken transom.

As the checkpoints went by a 10 HP duel was settling in between 162 and 105 with 124 a couple of minutes behind and trying to keep Greg and Margot Brandon at bay in 081. Another battle in the 10s was a family affair between the GFR entries with Daniel Rutherford and Tyron Morey in 185 giving Dad Rin with Jenny Leek a lesson on how to go fast,

as they pulled away from the black plastic duck.

Alloys live on

Although the alloy craft are slowly disappearing, two boats showed that they weren't slow with Ray Meagher and David Hey in 182 sitting around 5th place in 8 Sports and and the 178 Scott and Evans team moving through the Standard field. The 182 outfit wielding an old 7½ HP will be worrying some of the 10 HP crews as Ray's eyes are set on 10 HP for the 1997 Avon.

Pits turn into river

The normal pit area and start/finish at Nannup has become victim to the high water, so Race Director Brian Johns move the finish back to the Nannup road bridge, giving crews a dry work area and a more practical start for Day 2.

The Good, The Bad and The Ugly lead overnight

The boat looked "Good", the rain was "Bad" but will we mention the crew (" ") as the 162 outfit, once again, were overnight leaders in the Blackwood Classic 250. Still trying to hold off 105 with last year's winner 129 out with fuel problems and the 052 Lenz and Pozzi losing a lot of time

with gearbox disasters. **064** still headed Sports Class, although **177** Paris and Elliss had made up a great deal of time and were looking to be overnight leaders.

Standard Class had developed into a three-way battle between **044**, **028** and **139** with the **139** Tregurtha/Palfrey rubber duck looking for novice honours against the Sports boat of Blaise Paris and Donna Elliss.

poth run to Sues Bridge

As the river widened out the 10 HP duel remained the same although 003 Hall and "have a chat" Massam seemed to have gathered a shade more momentum. Judging by the speed he came into Sues Bridge, Paris and Elliss had managed to keep 064 and 007 at bay, although the three craft hit Sues Bridge finish line only a boat length apart.

Shane Tregurtha and Tony Palfrey pushed the Suzuki hard to claim the Standard Class lead by only 12 seconds from the Branson Brothers and they were set for a race to Augusta on Day 3.

A couple of fuel miscalculations saw 174 and 131 paddle to Sues but the total atrition rate still held at four.

Weir washed out as Goodbody and Green take line honours

Due to the high water levels, the action and fun of Jumping the weir on Day 3 disapppeared as boats prepared for the sprint to Augusta, hoping for calm conditions across the bay.

The 10 HP procession continued to the finish line although **081** the Barndon outfit had made up a great deal of time by Warner Glen, only to take a tumble after a classic spin out.

The interesting tussle in Sports Class developed further with the **064** Bolvary/Brooker machine rapidly eradicating a 2½ minute defecit and broke away from the field to win Sports.

Shallow water behind Malloy Island caught a few Standard boys but not before 139 Tregurtha/Palfrey held on their 12 second lead to take the honours with Paris and Ellis, although having to settle for second in Sport, collected the novice award.
