Power Dinghy Racer





FREDERICKSTOWN CUP: ALBANY

Several members have already approached me in regards to the Easter event planned for Albany. For those who are not aware, local authorities ruled against the running of the 1995 event after having competed at Albany for the previous 10 years.

A full application has been forwarded to all governing bodies to again conduct this event over the 1997 Easter weekend. To this date we have not received written approval from either parties but I will keep members informed so accommodation bookings etc can be made.

JANUARY GENERAL MEETING

Over the last few years the PDRC has found it difficult to get guorum of members at the January meeting due to holidays etc.

It has been decided that unless members have a specific subject to discuss in January, the January General Meeting will be combined with the February meeting on the 10 th February.

Should you have any objections to this decision please contact the Club Secretary no later than 9 December.

HEAD CASES

The question of what we should be wearing on our heads has been a controversial issue for as long as we have been racing dinghies. Over the years our regulations have gone from extreme to extreme; I raced my first Avon Descent 12 years ago wearing a plastic canoe helmet and now our 10 HP Class wear full face helmets that far exceed the requirement of road going motor cyclists.

The current WASDA regulations require that all competitors wear a helmet whilst racing. There are two requirement levels, depending on the Class of racing.

- 1 All Classes, except 10 HP Dinghies
 - a) conform to AS 2063
 - provide protection to forehead, temples and ears
 - non-elastic chinstrap
 - in good repair
 - other helmets not meeting AS 2063 may be approved by WASDA

10 HP Dinghies

- a) Conform to AS 1698 and Snell Dot 128 (wetstream)
- b) in good repair

Two relevant decisions have been passed since these rules were promulgated:

- 1 The 'Gath' surfing helmets were approved for use by all Classes except 10 HP dinghies.
- 2 A motion was passed that "By 1st May 1998 all power dinghy competitors must wear helmets carrying Association Standard 1698 and comply with Snell Dot 128 (wetstream)."

OK so that is the situation at present. If nothing happens then you will all be wearing the current 10 HP helmets in 18 months time.

e Committee decided therefore that it was time to review nelmets and come up with a new set of recommendations. The first task was to assess the standards and see which standards are applicable to our sport.

AS (Australian Standard) 2063 is the minimum requirement for cyclists.

AS 1698 is the minimum requirement for on-road motorcycle use.

The Snell foundation is a non-profit American organisation founded in 1957 to promote better helmets after the death by head injury of race car driver Peter Snell.

There are various Snell standards but they fall into three categories:

- M for motorcycle (eg M95 is a motorcycle helmet conforming to the 1995 standard)
- B for bicycle (eg B94)

SA for racing (SA helmets require flammability testing, allows narrower visual field and requires rollbar impact

Whilst researching these standards we found evidence (from the Snell Foundation themselves) that the Australian Standards are more stringent than the Snell standard. As we race in Australia and will be purchasing helmets in Australia for use in Australia on (mostly!) Australian heads, the PDRC have decided to use the Australian Standard as our benchmark.

I then called a joint meeting of the PDRC Management Committee and the PDRC Rules Committee — this group constitutes a good representation of racers from all Classes including parents or Rookies.

This joint meeting looked at examples of various helmets — BMX helmets, down hill cycle helmets, motocross helmets and motor cycle helmets.

We inspected them and compared them to our existing helmet range — the Gaths, Cobras, Laser wetstream and Scott Aspens.

After much deliberation the group have come up with the following recommendations:

- The current WASDA Dinghy Specification 7.2 and 7.3 and Formula 8, Formula 10 and Bathtub Specification 7.2 be replaced with the following:
 - 7.2 Helmets (All Classes except 10 HP dinghies)

Each competitor entered in an event shall wear a helmet that


- a) Meets Australian Standard 1698
- Has been approved by and appears on a list provided by the PDRC Management Committee and Rules Committee
- Provides protection to the forehead, temples and
- Chinstraps must be fitted with an approved quick release mechanism (if this mechanism is not a standard fitting on a particular helmet it must be fitted by an authorised dealer for that helmet).
- The Identification Number shall be displayed on both sides of the helmet. Each digit of the ID number shall be black, measuring a minimum of 70mm high and 10 mm in width, displayed on a solid canary yellow background measuring not less than 10 mm larger than the overall dimensions of the number.

7.3 Helmets (10 HP Dinghies)

Each competitor entered in an event shall wear a helmet that complies with Specification 7.2 and shall be a full face helmet or shall provide protection to the chin and mouth by means of a chin and mouth guard. Page 8

- The above specifications become mandatory on 1 May 1997.
- Any helmet (including Gath helmets) not conforming to specifications 7.2 or 7.3 will not be permitted after 1 May 1997.
- The addition to specification 7.2 that "By 1st May 1998 all power dinghy competitors must wear helmets carrying Australian Standard 1698 and Snell Dot 128 (wetstream)" be deleted.

The points 1–4 above will be put as formal motions at the December General Meeting. They have the unanimous approval of the PDRC Management Committee and Rules Committee and are proposed and seconded by the entire Committee.

Remember that other helmets, even if they meet AS1698 are not approved for use until they have been inspected and approved by the PDRC Management and Rules Committees. The reason for this is that AS1698 includes all motorcycle helmets, some of the large bulky and heavy helmets with very absorbent padding will obviously not be appropriate for our use.

All three of the newly approved helmets are available from Helmet House 911A Albany Highway, East Victoria Park and motor cycle accessory dealers.

Worth a mention are some of the latest Down-Hill cycle helmets. These helmets are very light and strong and would easily meet all of our criteria **except that** they do not carry any Australian Standard. Laser, for example produce a full face carbon-fibre helmet that will sell for \$189 (it has only just come on the market). The importers tell me that it will cost them \$10,000 to apply for AS Certification. They can sell the helmet in Australia by displaying a "For off-road use only" sticker.

It was a unanimous decision by the PDRC Committee that **only** helmets with AS1698 Certification will be permitted for dinghy racing, the down-hill helmets and BMX helmets will therefore not be approved.

If you have any queries regarding the new helmet regulations come along to the 9 December General Meeting.

FORMULA 8 DRIVERS TRAINING COURSE

A COMPULSORY TRAINING COURSE in safety, driving techniques, starts etc will be conducted for all Formula 8 drivers, Senior and Rookie, who are competing in their first season of racing.

The course is also open to all Formula 8 drivers or persons interested in competing in a Formula 8 this season, should they wish to attend.

The training course will be conducted at Burswood on Sunday 8 December 1996 at 9.30 am sharp (preceding the Burswood Bash event).

All those attending the course, if competing that day, must have their craft prepared for scrutineering prior to the commencement of the safety course.
