

PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO CONSTITUTION OF THE POWER DINGHY RACING CLUB (INC)

1) Clause 4 - Membership; ADD:

4.13 LIFE MEMBERSHIP

- **4.13a** The management committee may award a member a life membership by resolution of two thirds of the management committee present at a committee meeting.
- **4.13b** A nomination for award of a life membership must be addressed to the management committee, nominations must be proposed and seconded by full financial members.
- 4.13c The management committee may allocate no more than one life membership per Club year. Life membership should represent reward for outstanding individual contribution to the club.
- **4.13d** A life member shall be entitled to all benefits and voting rights of a full financial member.

RULE PROPOSALS

The following amendments to be discussed and voted on at the February General Meeting

The following section to be added to the Competition Rules:

- 24 Amendment of Competition Rules
- 24.1 Any amendment, deletion, addition or change or meaning to any part of the Rules must be ratified by resolution of a majority of the financial members present at a General Meeting.
- 24.2 Members must be notified in writing of any proposed amendments, deletion, addition or change or meaning to any part of these Rules at least seven (7) days prior to the General Meeting.
- 24.3 Any amendment, deletion, addition or change or meaning to any part of the Rules shall not come into effect until one calendar month after the resolution to amend, delete, add or change such rule was ratified at the General Meeting.
- 24.4 For the purposes of 24.2 notification in the Association Newsletter of any proposed amendment, deletion, addition or change or meaning to the Competition Rules shall be sufficient but not necessarily obligatory providing such notification occurs seven (7) days prior to any General Meeting.

I propose that oversize pistons be allowed to be fitted in the powerhead of any make or model of all classes of power dinghy, Formula 8 or bathtub racing.

To achieve this the following amendments need to be made to the Specifications.

Specification 8.3 amended to read:

Re-shaping, enlarging, polishing, performance or reliability modifications, except as provided in 8.14 through to 8.29 inclusive, to any part of the Outboard Motor shall not be allowed.

[the existing 8.28 has been changed to 8.29]

Specification 8.4 amended to read:

parts of the Outboard Motor and all parts replaced shall be standard manufacturers' parts for that power rating that have not been altered, except as provided in 8.14 through to 8.29 inclusive, and shall meet the specifications for that model and serial number as published in the Technical Specifications of this Manual or as specified in Competition Rule 9.4 e).

[the existing 8.28 has been changed to 8.29] A new Specification has to be included.

8.29 Oversize pistons may be used.

ROCKINGHAM REGATTA

A beach lined with umbrellas, a licensed bar courtesy of event sponsor Rockingham Beach Resort, Lesley's (now world renown) sausage sizzle (franchises are available) icecream van and a pit area bumper to bumper with boats. All this was only part of the 1996 PDRC Rockingham Regatta under event co-ordinator Kim Bolvary.

Following a very successful week's display of craft at the Rockingham City Shopping Centre the Rookies were chaffing at the bit to strut their stuff in front of the spectators gathering along the beach.

Our championship points leaders Jeremy Paull, Peter Barden and Shane Barden continued their battle with the **028** boat working its way from the rear of the field through to the placings on several occasions, with some brilliant driving and the assistance of the new Suzuki.

The adults F8s also put on a show for the crowd with a large field in the Men's class and a newcomer to F8 racing Craig Taylor jumping into the Watson outfit for his first-ever outing.

The ladies battle between points leader Rebecca Rutherford and Jamie Webb continued with Rebecca's consistency winning the day. The unluckiest competitor on the day was Kerry Barden who made her return to F8 racing only to be struck down with mechanical problems on two occasions whilst leading the field.

The Bathtub state championship is well and truly up for grabs as Justin Skewes grabbed another first for the day with some excellent starts, while Jarrod Street managed to hang on to his championship lead after some early mechanical problems.

Long-time racer Gary Evans made a return to tubbing and showed that he hasn't lost his touch of old, with a second on the day after a very consistent set of heats.

As the spectator numbers increased, the 10 hp class hit water and Justin Skewes with Peter Hink started where he left off in Bathtubs, hitting the start line on the drop of the flag, hotly pursued by Boat 167 Ian Williamson and Dennis (AI) Peach (good to see Dennis back in a boat) and the flying rubber duck of Mike Lenz and Kim Pozzi.

With the sea breeze starting to roll in, 23 Standard craft hit the water (YES 23!). The largest field of Standard craft to hit the water in a circuit race in the last 12 years. As the race started (the officials hair went greyer, the ulcers flared up and the cold beer after the event was looking better) when the 23 boats hit the first buoy together. A wall of water, a lot of noise, a few fists waving, the odd roll over, a couple overboard —and all of this for five heats!!

Many crews commented that it was the most fun they have had in years.
