AVON DESTRUCTION!

With the lowest water levels for 15 years it came as no surprise to see only 26 of the 76 entries finish the 1997 Coates Hire Avon Descent with the trying conditions taking their toll on man and machine.

The conditions provided a very different style of racing to previous years with a more conservative approach required and particular care needed to conserve your equipment. Those that did enjoyed the rewards of completing the worlds longest white water event in the conditions as tough as it ever gets. Those that ln't will have to wait until next year.

Jon Faull cemented his position as one of the best drivers in the event with another win in the 10hp class. Jeff and Tom Hodgkinson overcame mechanical difficulties, having to rebuild their motor more than three times in the week leading up to the event, to finish a creditable second

place. Jeff was remarkably composed on the Friday afternoon for somebody who with only hours to the start was still waiting for his motor to arrive from Perth. In third place was the consistent Justin Skewes teamed up with last years winning deckie, Justin Howarth. In 8hp sports Donna Elliss and Blaise Paris were patient in securing their win. After lying third after day 1 with a battered prop shaft, they took the slow train down the valley. The path to a win was cleared when the leading two boats on the first day

failed to finish. In second place was veteran Paul Tregurtha accompanied by Paul Morris with Jarrod Street and Scott Bennett coming home third.

In standard class Steve Brown made it two in a row with a total time well ahead of the winning 8hp sports boats. In second place was Dallas Grivas and Simon Chapman. Approximately 38 minutes behind was the third placed Greg Paull and Ray Payne.

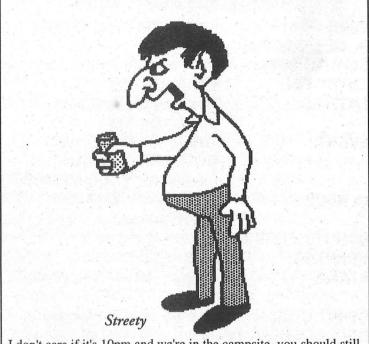
Unfortunately the lack of finances is slowing down the completion of the project but every effort is being made with the funds available to keep the project moving ahead.

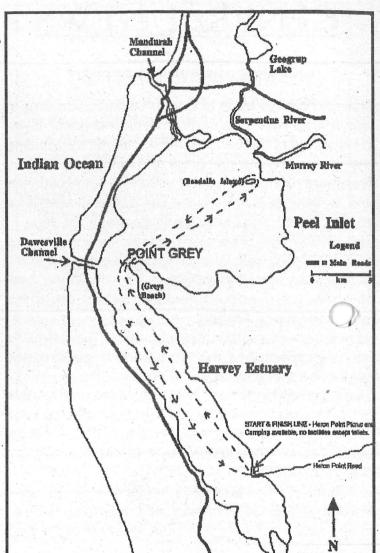

MAST AND FLAG

MAST AND FLAG MUST BE FITTED for the Peel Pursuit and must conform with WASDA spec. 7.8:

...shall have a mast, the top of which shall be a minimum of two (2) meters above the gunwhales. It shall be firmly and securely attached to the boat and shall be sufficiently rigid to have no more than one (1) meter of movement at its top. Attached to the top of the mast shall be a flag that is red or orange in colour. The flag may be rectangular or pennant shaped and shall measure not less than 600mm X 400mm.

MAP OF THE COURSE



THERE WILL BE TWO LAPS OF THE COURSE:

LAP 1: Heron point to Point Grey around Boodalin island and return to Heron Point. (Approx 65km)

THEN: Carry out a prop change and continue on with lap two

LAP 2: Heron point to Point Grey and return to Heron Point: (Approx 40km)

Total distance = approx. 105km

A FEW TIPS:

The race is a long one so make sure you carry plenty of fuel. The racing can be very close so any time that can be saved is a bonus. (It may be worth rehearsing a few prop changes.)

The Heron Point picnic area is an excellent camping spot and by all accounts a huge time was had by all on the Saturday night at last years event. Save yourself the rush down Sunday morning and camp the night and join in the festivities.
