propeller (his best one of course) and snap the skeg off his Suzuki and Ryan seemed to spend most of his time upside down!

David had his first big win with a huge increase in confidence and concentration and then tried to put it down to exhaust tubes!

Dinghies also raced hard with amazingly few incidents in the trying conditions.

The ongoing tussle between 142 and 021 entertained everyone and continued through all three classes. Jay and Nathan ended up winning the day over Glen and Brad in the 8hp classes, but lost out in 10hp.

Tyron and Arron won 10hp (over Glen and Brad) in a very controlled display of smooth driving. Keith and Chris put on a show by flipping their duck

twice - obviously trying hard. The amazing John Haynes put in his last race in a tub (again), then went on to compete in all three

dinghy classes!

Brad Watson put on the driving display of the day when the boat spat his deckie out in the middle of a race in front of the start buoy. Brad looped around, hauled his man in SAS-style and kept going—all without coming off the plane! Thanks to all the people who jumped in and helped, but particularly to Nick and Julie Thompson who did a fantastic job with the food supply with only a couple of day's notice.

THE BIRTH OF THE BATHTUB

anaimo Harbor in Canada was the scene of the first bathtub race extravaganza in 1967. As the City of NANAIMO's "Centennial Event" that year, close to 200 tubbers entered the fun competition and amazingly, 47 completed the 36 mile course to Vancouver's Fisherman's Cove across the straits of Georgia. Times have changed and now the "Great Race" finins at Departure Bay in h_laimo, covering a very grueling course that leaves Nanaimo harbor, circles Entrance Island, thence up to and around Winchelsea Island and then back to Nanaimo. In the early days, it was indeed a challenge to get past the starting line in the choppy confusion caused by an extra 785 observation and escort craft in Nanaimo harbor.

From the mayhem of the first bathtub race 33 years ago, the "NANAIMO TO NANAIMO IN-TERNATIONAL WORLD CHAM-PIONSHIP BATHTUB RACE & 4

Nanaimo Marine Festival has evolved. The unofficial start of the Nanaimo Marine Festival begins in the first week of July with the Tubbin Time Tonic contest where local "Mixologists" from all the pubs in

holic recipes for judging. The winning drink becomes the official Cocktail of the Nanaimo Marine Festival. The crowning of the Miss Nanaimo Ambassador at the Miss Nanaimo Pageant takes place in the evening at Beban Park auditorium on the 2nd Saturday in July. Miss Nanaimo is then officially crowned "Mermaid Royalty" to reign over all the festivities during the Marine Festival. The Wednesday after this crowning sees the unveiling and cutting of the "Official" Nanaimo Marine cake.

The "Official" start to the 4 day Nanaimo Marine Festival kicks off with the opening of the Marine Festival Food Fare, Kiddies Harborside Playlot, Kiddies Karnival and then on to the city center where the Nanaimo City Centre Association (NCCA) unveils it's 3 day "Bathtub Street Fair". This Fair includes many zany events such as the Bank Managers' Tricycle race, Egg Toss Contest and the World Champion-

ship Waiter's Race. Mid morning on the 3rd Saturday of the month the annual Sailpast on Wheels Fun Parade takes place through the city centre followed by the NCCA sponsored Bathtub Street Fair events downtown and at Swy-a-lana Lagoon & Maffeo Sutton Parks. In the evening the pace really picks up with the traditional

> "Sacrifice to the Gods" Bathtub boat burning ceremony. The evening is concluded in spectacular fashion a full-on with

lights, music and firework's display. The "Great Race" starts at 11.00am the next day with literally thousands of spectators lining the harbour banks. What faces the drivers is a 2 hour challenge of man and machine against the power of the sea. All in all the festival, race and presentations take in four full days of fun and activities for the young, old and in between. It truly is a fabulous spectacle: a great event that is unrivalled anywhere in the world. You could be part of it

The PDRC is endeavouring to send the 1999/2000 season's Tub champion to Canada to compete in next year's championships.
