The day was 13th November 1999. The Avon water was thick muddy and brown. It was slippery water; water that would produce record times – a Dinghy racer's paradise!


The event started with eight boats at around 2.45pm with the conventional circuit. Then it all quantities of the next event was to race the course backwards. The third was

Thankyou to all the members who joined NADA to attend their AGM and show support for Jim Smith's Race Director nomination. As things evolved the other nominations withdrew prior to the meeting heralding the reason for our attendance - a great success! As far as our club is concerned and the involvement with NADA we have been given the promise of an expansion in our role with the race organisation.

I have forwarded a letter to Glen Coles, Chairman of the WARWSA Board, outlining the club's concern with the delays in finalising the finance to build the ceiling, bar and kitchen facility at Burswood. I also indicated that the Marathon Club were looking at three other venues and would only be able to raise \$100,000,00 not \$150,000,00, which Glen wanted for them to buy into WARWSA. To help resolve the problem I have offered WARWSA a loan from the PDRC to get on with the job. Approximately \$40,000.00 is required for the work which could be recouped at commercial rates or from the funds received from the new building partner.

Whatever happens, it is clear that if we do not push the issue we will not get the next stage of the buildina finished.

As I mentioned at the last meeting, the situation with 8 HP Sport Class of Racing needs to be seriously looked at. There have been various ideas put forward to drop the class and consolidate Dinghy Racing. At our next meeting in December an open forum will be conducted to establish the direction to be taken for possible class changes. If you are an 8 HP SPORTS Class racer it will be imperative that you attend the meeting.

The Bath Tub season got off to a great start at Burswood then suffered a death at Northam with only four boats entering for the event. Ian Williamson and the Committee are currenty discussing where we go now with the remaining tubbers.

Neville and his gang organised yet another successful Northam Regatta. The idea of a Fun Day was taken up by a few teams who stayed on to enjoy Nev's country hospitality at the farm. As previously mentioned the field of tubs and Formula 8's were down on expectations, however, those who attended Sunday's race certainly got value for money with a close, competitive field.

Jacci's first race was at the Burswood Carnival back in October where she managed to finish a very respectable 3rd overall for the day. (Not bad considering she had never been behind the wheel of an F8 except for a brief one hour practice session the day prior)



During this practice session Jacci managed to actually flip her F8 rig: a very rare occurrence indeed for F8's because they are usually so inherently stable and forgiving. Not to be deterred Jacci climbed straight back in the "pilot's" seat and completed her practice session and the race the next day. Strangely at the recent Northam Regatta meeting, Jacci tumbled the boat again and finished the day in 3rd place.

There is no doubt Jacci's style is indeed agressive and "pedal to the metal" !!

PDRC news spoke to Jacci after the incident at Northam. "It happened really quickly, so quickly

that I was unable to recover the lose". When asked if she was deterred by the incident Jacci sa "No. not in the least. These things make you all the more determined to go faster and strive for success. What I will say is; that it does make you appreciate the safety gear that we all wear and the pre-race scrutineering to keep all craft at proper and safe working levels".

Jacci at only 18 years of age has plenty of time to mature and set her sights on the No1 position. That won't be easy, however, because the form displayed by Kasey Coates in the first two race events of the year has been simply superb.





Thank you to all competitors for your prompt arrival at the designated time for scrutineering; this always makes the scrutineer's job a lot easier and helps the day run smoothly.

I must congratulate the Formula 8 crews for the high standards they are setting for the presentation of their craft. Not only are the aesthetics of a high standard, but most importantly, the safety aspects of the craft have in most cases been first class.

Bath tubs and dinghys however need a bit of work as we seem to be setting a standard of who can keep the 3M company in business by the amount of tape we are using to hold our craft together. Surely this must be creating a weakness in the structure of the dinghies, leading to delamination and inevitably costing valuable race points. (DNF)

Time to get the fibreglass out boys, as I am sure the CHIEF SCRUTI-NEER will look at this at the next circuit race. Also <u>ALL CRAFT</u> that wish to participate in the Australia Day circuit race will have to be in tip top shape. We will be on show that day so let's all have our craft looking the best they possibly can.

On another matter, I am disappointed with some people's attitude toward the COMMITTEE members who are setting standards for the safety of participants and spectators. These safety policies are set down to cover DUTY OF CARE and are to be followed by all club members. Furthermore, the club recently took out

further insurance to cover our duty of care during these club events and mittee members have a right to enforce these rules. I am referring to certain people who feel they do not have to comply with club policies when getting into the rescue boats. The committee expects helmets, life jackets and safe footwear to be worn at all times and in most circumstances a wetsuit as well. The committee also does not expect to be abused by its members when enforcing these policies. We have your safety at heart.

Thank you to the people who did get into the rescue boats and complied with the safety standards as the events would not have commenced on time without your help.
