
MILL START INFO

To Begin: The screen will flash MILL on a dark

green background.




60 will be displayed to begin the one minute countdown, this will be displayed on a light green background will hold for 45 seconds.

Brad Kitcher has researched the possibility of getting an exemption for the supply of 2 stroke motors into WA. After going through the process it became apparent that the amount of motors needed to be bought out-weighed his needs. After getting all the paperwork completed he has now passed it onto myself to offer to the motors to club members for purchase.

So, we have available to us as a club 9.9 D2 Tohatsu/Mercury outboards. There are some rules in owning these motors and they can not leave the club for 3 years.

We need to purchase a minimum of 35 outboards by the end of the 24 month period of exemption, which has already started.

A local marine company has offered to help us get these motors through and delivered to WA.

Minimum orders of 10 at a time. Freight costs may differ on orders, making costs go up slightly as time goes by.

There is paperwork and ongoing records required for every single motor we purchase and they are intended for racing use and not just for people to put in their sheds.

And once again, they can't be sold outside of the club for a period and this is monitored by the government.

At the moment the ball park figure of a single motor in a 10 motor minimum order will be around \$2600.

As a club, we need to get behind this. If we can not fill the 35 minimum order, I would say this will not be available again.



I would like to start a register for anyone wanting to purchase one or more of these motors. Once we start the list, I will show everyone the requirements for buying one and who and when to pay. Orders will go through the dealer and motors will be received by the dealer once shipped.

- Be aware of, and maintain an uncompromising understanding of and adhesion to, Power Dinghy Racing Club of WA Constitution, Competition Rules and Specifications documents.
- Act in a way that provides a good example to junior and new members to the club.
- Refrain from any form of harassment of others.
- Refrain from any behaviour that may bring the Power Dinghy Racing Club of WA into disrepute.
- Provide a safe environment for the conduct of racing power dinghies and training.
- Be a positive role model.
- Understand that race teams are responsible for the behaviour and actions of their support crew and affiliates at race events and weekends away with the club.
- Be aware of the constitution paragraph 20. "Discipline" specifically 20.1 relating to "reasons".
- Understand that the competition rules and specifications documents are the responsibility of all members. Utilise the rule proposal process to maintain workable documents for the current racing format.
- Understand that it is management committees responsibility to uphold the rulebook as it reads.

COMMITTEE POSITIONS TO BE VOTED ON 13 APRIL 1992







It was a beautiful spring day with perfect blue sky and glass-like water. We started early, arriving before 7 so we could bring the boat into the beach and get all the set up done before any public arrived. By 8 we were done, and after a quick breakfast at the Dome we waited for the festival to begin. 94.5 Pete and Kymba were there live as well as Old Macdonald's Travelling Farms, Masters Cows, face painting, kids inflatable water slide and some fun stalls were to make the day for everyone.

At 10 am things kicked off with the live broadcast on 94.5 starting and all the activities getting underway. Masters supplied the refreshments with free samples being given to everyone. Pete and Kymba started the water activities off, taking their craft built by Subiaco Mens, Shed, out for a water test. After a bit of a wobbly start Pete and Kymba got out on to the water, the craft, a simple row boat design, went well and had only a few cartons fall off as they traversed the course. With the course now tested it was time to begin the racing.

Race 1 - Saw the first of the home made boats enter the water. Masters Moo Tineers took an early lead and never looked back taking the first race with little competition. Back in the pack many of the boats were struggling for stability or just sinking, which only made it more of a spectacle.

Race 2 - Our race. As we waited on the start line, tension was high as we ended up in a bad place on the grid with little to no room to paddle. As the start horn sounded, Sam and Alex started to paddle, almost submerging the MSS crew, whose craft was already lacking buoyancy so a wave of water from our paddles didn't help. Alex and Sam tore out of the gate taking an early lead.









Before the race started the Nauti Buoys and the Bartons looked to be our real competition, however as soon as the race started the Nauti Buoys craft had a catastrophic failure causing one crew member to be left in the water slowing their take off. The Bartons on the other hand were hot on the tail of Sam and Alex, looking to close the gap, they tried to increase their pace only to roll the craft and allow Sam and Alex to take Race 2 with a full half lap lead. So much of a lead they were almost forgotten as all the action was happening behind them with a 4 way battle for second. Alex and Sam were back on the beach with a drink in hand when somehow the Nauti Buoys over took Cow Shark and Wally Wafarers to take out second place.

Race 3 - Was another great race with lots of mishaps and capsizes, but Hovertron was the clear winner as they led from start to finish in their transforming craft.

It was a wonderful day for all and the win was a bonus. We took our craft home and are now planning next years event.

For 2024 I want PDRC to have the biggest craft there. To do this I need lots of masters 600ml milk cartons, so many its ridiculous, 3 thousand would be great......

The 2 main ideas are a large Castle or a Trophy both built on a large pontoon setup so we can reuse this years cartons in the 2024 race and maybe then use all of them in the 2025 race.

The Trophy would just be a big box with this years boat on top and a plaque that says 2023 Race 2 winners. The castle would mean the destruction of the 23 craft to use the components in constructing the castle with parapets and maybe even a cannon on top (or a rookie with a super soaker). Both Crafts in 24 would be powered by 4 paddlers (Light volunteers required) and if all goes well, in 2025 we can use the trophy or castle as the centre for our massive battleship craft. It would be powered by 6 paddlers with 2 rookies manning the gun turrets. It's a big plan but anything is possible if we can just collect all the cartons.

Supplementary Regulations'

The Australia Day race is a closed event conducted under the competition rules of The Power Dinghy Racing Club of WA. The race director may make a ruling on any matter not specifically covered by the competition rules or supplementary contained in this publication. The Australia Day event is round 1 of the Club State Championship and will carry Championship points as per rule 1822. Jump starts: Procedure as per rules 1009/1013. Only 2 heat restarts will be allowed. All craft incurring breakdowns or flips will be allocated 5min to restart thier engine before the mill flag goes up for the next heat from the time the craft enters the pit area or lands on the beach. If a craft races in multiple classes they will only be eligable for championship points for one nominated class. All championship points from each class will only be applicable to those craft that have nominated for that particular class. Any podium finishes will be recognised in each class but point allocation will be as previously stated.

All craft will be subject to scrutineering prior to competition (including F8's & Tub's).

Standard and Super Standard entrants will be subject to a carby check prior to competition.


