### 6.10 Dead Heats

### 6.10.1 Dead Heat in A Circuit Heat

Points in accordance with Rule  $\underline{18.7.2}$  shall be awarded equally. Points for the next place shall not be allocated.

### 6.10.2 Dead Heat in A Program of Races

Dead Heats shall be determined by count back with the craft gaining the greatest number of higher places being placed ahead.

If the dead heat still cannot be resolved, the craft that placed highest in the last race will be placed ahead.

### 6.10.3 Dead Heat (Distance Race/River Race)

If Teams finish with equal elapsed time, then equal points in accordance with rule 18.7 will be awarded to each of the craft involved and the points for the next lower place will not be awarded.

For example, if two boats finish equal 4<sup>th</sup>, both teams are awarded points for 4<sup>th</sup> place (60 points each) and 5<sup>th</sup> place points will not be awarded.

When the results will be used to determine starting grids for subsequent races, the craft holding the higher club championship points will be granted the opportunity to select its preferred grid position first.

#### 6.11 Results

All results will be provisional until all Protests and Appeals have been heard.

### 9.3 Production of Technical Specifications

If the full technical specifications for a motor are not listed in the Club's Technical Specifications, or superseded parts are being replaced on a motor listed in the Club's Technical Specifications (refer specification rule 12.11.2), it is the responsibility of the competitor racing that motor to provide a complete list of measurements required (as per the Club's Technical Specifications) fourteen (14) days prior to a pre-event scrutineering or make alternative arrangements with the Rules Committee fourteen (14) days prior to the commencement of the event.

### 22.10 Junior Licence

To obtain this grade of Competition Licence a competitor shall:

- a) be not less than fourteen (14) years of age and not more than seventeen (17) years of age as at the date of issue.
- b) fulfil the requirements for issue.

### 22.10.1 Junior Licence May Be Upgraded

A Junior Licence holder may have a Competition Licence upgraded to a General Drivers Licence for a particular event.

A Junior Licence Holder may have a Competition Licence upgraded to a Super Standard Drivers Licence, Sports Drivers Licence, or Sports Co-Driver Licence to compete in closed water circuit events only. The Competition Points requirement for the requested licence still applies and cannot be reduced.

Any competitor racing with an upgraded Junior Licence must be accompanied by a competitor not less than seventeen (17) years of age except for closed water circuit events. (See Rule 3.5)

A Rookie Licence holder that has been upgraded to a Junior Licence under Rule <u>22.9.2</u> cannot have their licence upgraded further under this rule.

### 2325 PREMIUM TO BE PAID BEFORE COMPETITION LICENCE ISSUED

The premium shall be paid before a Competition Licence is issued or re-issued.

During a circuit race a white flag will be used to indicate the final lap of a heat.

### 10.2.4 Yellow Flag

A yellow flag denotes Caution. Slow down and be aware of obstacles, craft, or crew in the water.

### 10.1.3Penalty for False Start

The penalty for a false start (that is, contrary to Rule 10.1.1) shall be:

- a) In a river or distance race, a 60 second penalty added to the elapsed time of the offending craft.
